THEME: Palm Sunday

**SENTENCE:** At the name of Jesus, every knee shall bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Philippians 2:10–11

### **READINGS INTRODUCTIONS:**

**Isaiah 50:4-9a**. Even as the exiles set out to return from Babylon after 537 BC, the prophet who added to Isaiah feels the need to reflect on the suffering that had been Israel's lot, as part of God's plan.

<u>Ps 118:1-2,19-29.</u> A song of victory: the stone that the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone.

<u>Mark 11:1-11</u>. All four Gospels tell of the entry of Jesus into Jerusalem before his arrest. In Mark the emphasis is on how Jesus' arrival challenges the failure of the authorities to produce the fruit God expects.

Isaiah 25:6-9. Psalm 118:1-2,14-24. Acts 10:34-43. John 20:1-18.

### THOUGHTS ON THE READINGS.

The climax of the Gospel of the Palms is Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. The city is to become the stage upon which the drama of salvation will be acted out. Psalm 118, with its cry of 'hosanna' ('save us now') quoted in the Gospel, was traditionally sung in Jerusalem as a thanksgiving for the King's victory. For us, the church building into which we may process becomes our Jerusalem: the place where in Holy Week we shall celebrate the victory of Christ our King. We have begun a journey and there is no turning back.

- <sup>1</sup> Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good! His faithful love endures forever.
- <sup>2</sup> Let all Israel repeat: "His faithful love endures forever."

- <sup>20</sup> These gates lead to the presence of the LORD, and the godly enter there.
