THOUGHTS ON THE READINGS.

Mary's encounter with the living Christ is one of the most moving in Scripture. Called by name, Mary saw and believed. But Peter and the Beloved Disciple did not see Jesus at the tomb: only an empty tomb and discarded grave clothes. Yet these were sufficient for the Beloved Disciple to 'see and believe.' John later proclaims 'Blessed are those who have not seen, and yet have come to believe.' (*John 20:29b.*) This stands for us. We have not seen the



risen Christ, yet we can have faith in his resurrection: his power to change life for this world and the next.

RSCM Sunday by Sunday

Ps 118:1-2,14-24.

1 Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good! His faithful love endures forever.

2 Let all Israel repeat:

"His faithful love endures forever."

14 The Lord is my strength and my song; he has given me victory.

15 Songs of joy and victory are sung in the camp of the godly. The strong right arm of the Lord has done glorious things!

16 The strong right arm of the Lord is raised in triumph. The strong right arm of the Lord has done glorious things!

17 I will not die; instead, I will live to tell what the Lord has done.

18 The Lord has punished me severely, but he did not let me die.
