SENTENCE: 'Peace be with you,' says the Lord, 'As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' John 20:21.

COLLECT:

God you are the first light cutting through the void. You are the final light which we shall enjoy forever. Help us to welcome the light and walk in it always. This we ask through Jesus Christ our Redeemer, Amen.



READINGS:

Acts 4:32-35. The early chapters of the Acts of the Apostles tell of the life of the early church in Jerusalem. It was only in Jerusalem that the first Christians practised communal living for a time.

Psalm 133. How good it is to live in unity.

1 John 1:1-2:2. The first letter of John is a treatise, possibly by the author of the Fourth Gospel, addressed to the church, recalling them to the heart of their faith in what God has done in the person of Jesus.

John 20:19-31. The Gospel of John reaches a climax in an act of new creation. As God breathed life into creation, so the risen Christ breathes on his disciples in a new creation by forgiveness and faith.
