14th APRIL 2024 3rd SUNDAY OF EASTER

THEME: As far as the East is from the West.

READINGS:

Acts 3:12-19. In Acts, Peter's great speech on the Day of Pentecost is followed by the healing of a cripple at the temple gate. Peter then offers this explanation of the event.

Psalm 4. David makes a confident appeal for deliverance from his enemies. **1 John 3:1-7.** The first letter of John is a treatise that reflects the teaching of the message of the gospel in John's church at the end of the first century AD. God's love for us should be expressed in our love for each other.

Luke 24:36b-48. The Gospel of Luke ends with the commissioning of the disciples to proclaim the good news, and with the promise of the power of the Holy Spirit to enable them to do this.

THOUGHTS ON THE READINGS.

There was a belief in the ancient world that ghosts have no feet. It seems likely that this was one reason that the evangelists mention Jesus' feet when recording his resurrection appearances. Here Jesus encourages his disciples, "Look at my hands and my feet... touch me and see" (Luke 24:39.) This, and eating a piece of broiled fish, removes any doubt among them that he is truly risen. We get a tantalising glimpse here of what a resurrection body might be like, but more important is that his resurrection leads to a commission for the disciples, there is a job to be done.

Psalm 4 A psalm of David.

1 Answer me when I call to you,

O God who declares me innocent.

Free me from my troubles.

Have mercy on me and hear my prayer.

- 2 How long will you people ruin my reputation? How long will you make groundless accusations? How long will you continue your lies?
- 3 You can be sure of this:

The Lord set apart the godly for himself.

The Lord will answer when I call to him.

- 4 Don't sin by letting anger control you.

 Think about it overnight and remain silent.
- 5 Offer sacrifices in the right spirit, and trust the Lord.
- 6 Many people say, "Who will show us better times?" Let your face smile on us, Lord.
- 7 You have given me greater joy than those who have abundant harvests of grain and new wine.
- 8 In peace I will lie down and sleep, for you alone, O Lord, will keep me safe.
