THOUGHTS ON THE READINGS.

It may seem surprising that only Matthew, the most Jewish of the Evangelists, records this visit: Gentiles, possibly even astrologers, coming to worship the infant Jesus and bearing obscure and opulent gifts. Yet both aspects fulfilled prophetic oracles and foreshadowed a world-wide church. The visit almost became counter-productive when Herod was alerted to this newborn king; to the tyrant's warped, jealous mind even such a child constituted an unacceptable threat, whether directly or as a focus of messianic aspirations. Nevertheless, the child was kept safe when God again directed the Magi – this time by a dream, not a star.

RSCM Sunday by Sunday

Psalm 72:1-7,10-15. A psalm of Solomon.

1 Give your love of justice to the king, O God, and righteousness to the king's son.

2 Help him judge your people in the right way; let the poor always be treated fairly.

3 May the mountains yield prosperity for all, and may the hills be fruitful. 4 Help him to defend the poor, to rescue the children of the needy,

and to crush their oppressors.

5 May they fear you as long as the sun shines, as long as the moon remains in the sky. Yes, forever!

6 May the king's rule be refreshing like spring rain on freshly cut grass, like the showers that water the earth.

7 May all the godly flourish during his reign. May there be abundant prosperity until the moon is no more.

10 The western kings of Tarshish and other distant lands will bring him tribute. The eastern kings of Sheba and Seba will bring him gifts. 11 All kings will bow before him, and all nations will serve him.

12 He will rescue the poor when they cry to him; he will help the oppressed, who have no one to defend them.

13 He feels pity for the weak and the needy, and he will rescue them.

14 He will redeem them from oppression and violence, for their lives are precious to him.

15 Long live the king! May the gold of Sheba be given to him. May the people always pray for him and bless him all day long.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit As it was in the beginning, is now and shall be for ever. Amen
