THEME: Guide me O thou great Redeemer.

SENTENCE: O Lord, you have examined my heart and know everything about me. You know when I sit down or stand up. You know my thoughts even when I'm far away. *Psalm 139:1,2.*

COLLECT:

Praise to you, God our creator, for all your work among us. Yours is the vigour in creation, yours is the impulse in our new discoveries. Make us adventurous, yet reverent and hopeful in all we do. Hear our prayer we ask for the glory of your name. Amen.



READINGS INTRODUCTIONS:

<u>1 Samuel 3:1-20</u>. The first book of Samuel covers the history of Israel between the judges and the monarchy that began with Saul in the 11th century BC. Samuel was the last of the judges.

Psalm 139:1-5,12-18. The Lord knows us and our ways intimately; the Lord's works are wonderful.

<u>1</u> Corinthians 6:12-20. Paul himself began the church in Corinth, but problems emerged there, with some people arguing that Christians could do what they liked. Paul wrote from Ephesus to try to sort things out.

John 1:43-51. In John's Gospel, one of Jesus' first acts is to gather around himself a group of disciples. The group includes Nathanael (probably the same person as Bartholomew), an Israelite without guile.

Psalm 139:1-5,12-18

A psalm of David.

1 O Lord, you have examined my heart and know everything about me.

2 You know when I sit down or stand up. You know my thoughts even when I'm far away.

3 You see me when I travel and when I rest at home. You know everything I do.

4 You know what I am going to say even before I say it, Lord.

5 You go before me and follow me. You place your hand of blessing on my head.

11 I could ask the darkness to hide me and the light around me to become night—

12 but even in darkness I cannot hide from you. To you the night shines as bright as day. Darkness and light are the same to you.

13 You made all the delicate, inner parts of my body and knit me together in my mother's womb.

14 Thank you for making me so wonderfully complex! Your workmanship is marvellous—how well I know it.

15 You watched me as I was being formed in utter seclusion, as I was woven together in the dark of the womb.

16 You saw me before I was born. Every day of my life was recorded in your book. Every moment was laid out before a single day had passed.

17 How precious are your thoughts about me, O God. They cannot be numbered!

18 I can't even count them; they outnumber the grains of sand! And when I wake up, you are still with me!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit As it was in the beginning, is now and shall be for ever. Amen
