**THEME:** Enabled to serve.

**SENTENCE:** Those who trust in the Lord will find new strength. They will soar high on wings like eagles. They will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not faint.

Isaiah 40:31

#### **COLLECT:**

Almighty God, you have called us to serve you, yet without your grace we are not able to please you; mercifully grant that your Holy Spirit may in all things direct and rule our hearts; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen



#### **READINGS INTRODUCTIONS:**

**Isaiah 40:21-31**. At the end of the exile in 537 BC an anonymous author added to the eighth century book of the prophet Isaiah. He offers words of comfort and encouragement for those now returning to Israel.

**Psalm 147:1-11,20c.** The Lord heals the broken-hearted.

<u>1 Corinthians 9:16-23</u>. Paul wrote his first letter to the church in Corinth in the early 50s AD. He himself had founded the church in Corinth, and in his letter emphasises his apostolic authority.

<u>Mark 1:29-39</u>. In Mark's Gospel, the ministry of Jesus begins with his baptism by John. The signs of the presence of the kingdom of God include the healing of the sick, but the spoken message is also important to Jesus.

#### THOUGHTS ON THE READINGS.

Three tensions emerge as Jesus' reputation grows. One is the balance between healing and teaching; the curing of Simon's mother-in-law triggers many similar requests, but Jesus affirms preaching as his priority. Secondly, he engages with demonic forces, who recognise his unique identity but must be silenced so that he can make himself known on God's terms. The third tension concerns geography; Jesus could have filled his time in one location, but knows he needs to travel widely.
