Knowing & Sharing Christ's Aroha

10th MARCH 2024 4th SUNDAY IN LENT

THEME: Acting in faith is a deliberate decision.

SENTENCE:. The Son of Man must be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. *John 3:14–15.*

COLLECT:

Most merciful God, by the passion of your Son Jesus Christ you delivered us from the power of darkness; grant that through faith in him who suffered on the cross we may be found acceptable in your sight, through our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen



READINGS INTRODUCTIONS:

<u>Numbers 21:4-9</u>. This episode from the story of the Exodus reflects ideas of sympathetic magic, which was practised in Egypt. The Gospel reading draws a parallel with Christ on the cross.

Ephesians 2:1-10. In the opening of his general letter, Ephesians, Paul tells how God has accomplished his purpose by making our salvation depend solely on trusting God's grace.

Psalm 107:1-3,17-22. The steadfast Lord heals those who are sick who cry to him.

John 3:14-21. The early chapters of John show Jesus superseding things: ritual water becomes gospel wine; the temple becomes the temple of Christ's body; Nicodemus learns about new birth.

Next week's readings:

Jeremiah 31:31-34. Psalm 51:1-12, or 119:1-16. Hebrews 5:5-10. John 12:20-33.

THOUGHTS ON THE READINGS.

One of the New Testament's most familiar passages opens with a reference to one of the Old's most obscure; both hinge on a sign 'lifted up' for maximum visibility, and the need to respond with trusting obedience. As Moses' contemporaries needed to believe and look at the bronze serpent to be healed from snake bites, so everyone needs to look towards Christ, God's crucified, life-giving gift of love, with faith. The initiative is God's; the consequences are serious, but the choice – accepting the gracious offer, or staying unexposed and unreconciled in the apparent comfort of the shadows – is ours.

RSCM Sunday by Sunday

Psalm 107:1-3,17-22.

- 1 Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good! His faithful love endures forever.
- 2 Has the Lord redeemed you? Then speak out! Tell others he has redeemed you from your enemies.
- 3 For he has gathered the exiles from many lands, from east and west, from north and south.
- 17 Some were fools; they rebelled and suffered for their sins.
- 18 They couldn't stand the thought of food, and they were knocking on death's door.
- 19 "Lord, help!" they cried in their trouble, and he saved them from their distress.
- 20 He sent out his word and healed them, snatching them from the door of death.
- 21 Let them praise the Lord for his great love and for the wonderful things he has done for them.
- 22 Let them offer sacrifices of thanksgiving and sing joyfully about his glorious acts.
- Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit As it was in the beginning, is now and shall be for ever. Amen.
